What to Expect as a Greenbelt Volunteer

First and foremost, we are so appreciative of your help!

So you can expect a warm and welcoming environment! Once you're on board, we'll be sending you a monthly volunteer e-newsletter that features volunteer opportunities, and a link to software where you can log in to schedule your volunteering and track your hours.

Here are some important guidelines:

- Please be on time. If you could arrive 15 minutes before your scheduled volunteer shift, it will give us time to check you in and make sure we answer any of your questions.
- Please read our volunteer policy and sign your volunteer waiver when you create your log-in
- Keep an eye on the weather and wear appropriate clothes (see checklist)
- Please take proper steps to ensure your safety on the trail
- If you are approached by the media, please refer them to a Greenbelt staff member.
- Please cancel at least 72 hours in advance if you cannot make your volunteer commitment.

What to Wear

Identify yourself as a volunteer with your Greenbelt lanyard.

Every Greenbelt volunteer is given a personalized lanyard which we hope you will wear during your volunteer shift.

In the Office & Indoor Events

We ask that you dress comfortably yet appropriately for a casual office setting.



Outdoor Events & Programming

Recommended for your backpack:

- Cell phone*
- Personal first aid kit
- Food and water
- Sunscreen
- Extra socks
- Insect repellent
- A rain jacket

Clothing Checklist

- Practical hiking attire layers for the weather, long pants and long sleeves if in the woods
- Practical footwear hiking boots or other sturdy outdoor footwear
- Accessories sunglasses and a hat

- Field guides
- Binoculars
- Camera

As needed for tasks

- Any necessary tools
- Work gloves

A Note about Safety and Insurance

Volunteer safety is our top priority.

All volunteers are cautioned to use common sense and follow all prescribed safety procedures and operating instructions. Any accident, injury or illness should be immediately reported to their supervisor.

Greenbelt maintains valid Commercial General Liability, Directors and Officers Liability, Volunteer Accident Insurance, and Worker's Compensation Insurance. Greenbelt volunteers who have signed a Greenbelt Volunteer Agreement are deemed to be Greenbelt workers while they are performing work for Greenbelt. Workers are advised that if injured in a work-related accident, they can claim worker's compensation benefits and cannot sue Greenbelt, their employer or any other employer covered under the Workers compensation act.

YOU MUST SIGN A GREENBELT VOLUNTEER AGREEMENT TO BE OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZED AS A GREENBELT VOLUNTEER.

Property Monitor

Be the eyes and ears of our Land Stewardship team.

Visit your property a minimum of once a season

An excellent opportunity for people who like to hike and want to work independently. Volunteers agree to steward an assigned property and submit regular status reports. They work directly with the Land Manager and Trails Coordinator.

- Attend an orientation meeting
- Represent Greenbelt in a professional and positive manner
- Be reliable and responsible
- Be amenable to being outside in all seasons
- Have computer access to submit reports electronically

Osprey Monitor

Document the behavior of Osprey in Essex County.

Visit a nest at least once a week to record observations

Season: April-August. Volunteers submit an online data sheet once a week and can email photos as well. Volunteers work directly with the Director of Land Stewardship.

Volunteer Requirements

- Respect and uphold Greenbelt's mission
- Attend an orientation meeting
- Represent Greenbelt in a professional and positive manner
- Be reliable and responsible
- Recognize Osprey
- Be able to visit the nest for at least 15 minutes/week
- Have computer access to submit reports electronically
- Have a pair of binoculars or spotting scope


